GREEN TRANSITION AND INCREASE IN ENERGY SUPPLY NEEDED

Although Italy has been moving in a more sustainable direction, there are still steps to be taken in the green transition of the country. According to the International Energy Agency, more than 45 % of the energy supply stems from oil and coal, while Italy imports energy to meet the energy demand. This represents a great opportunity for Danish companies operating in the industry to introduce themselves and potentially fill the gap in the Italian supply chain.

The Italian Energy Sector

Key Facts

- Italy is one of the countries that have led the deployment of renewable energies. It is also one of the eight EU members that have committed to phase out of coal in their National Energy and Climate Plans (2021-2030)
- Italy has a long-term vision for its energy strategy: to achieve 28% of energy consumption from renewable sources, with a target of 55% of production coming from 'green' sources
- In 2020, the total energy produced by hydroelectric, solar, wind, bioenergy and geothermal power accounted for 17.8% of final gross Italian consumption, exceeding the 17% target set for the same year
- €74.3 billion of EU Recovery Fund will be allocated to "green revolution"
- Italy ranks 17th in terms of attractiveness for foreign and national investments in the renewable energy sector and according to the "Renewable Energy Country Attractiveness Index"

Overview

In 2019 Italy launched the "Integrated National Energy and Climate Plan" (INECP) with the aim to contribute to a wide-ranging transformation of Italy's economy. Decarbonisation, Circular Economy, Energy Efficiency and the rational and fair use of natural resources represent the main objectives and tools for an economy that is more respectful of people and the environment.

Decarbonisation is the main objective of the plan: 2030 has been set as an interim milestone with the aim of achieving full decarbonisation of the energy sector by 2050 and integrating environmental factors in other public policies.

Italy plans to reach the target of 30% of gross final consumption of energy from renewable sources by 2030, defining a pathway of sustainable growth for renewable sources and the full integration thereof into the system.

Key Opportunities in the market

- Estimate of €180 bil investments within 2030 for the National Energy System.
- Further investments of €27.5 bil in Photovoltaic sector to reach INECP targets
- EU Recovery Fund: Italy has drawn up a "National Recovery and Resilience Plan" (NRRP) which includes energy efficiency and renewable energy as key sectors. In particular, 18.22 bil € will be allocated to Renewable Energy projects and 29.35 bil € to energy efficiency projects
