Danish Energy Transition Initiative

In 2021, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Climate, Energy and Utilities launched the Danish Energy Transition Initiative (DETI). The initiative will focus on short term but intensive collaboration about green transition with developing countries. Initially the initiative will focus on Brazil, Columbia and Pakistan. The focus of collaboration in Pakistan is energy efficiency, while it in Algeria also involves wind resources, long-term planning and the integration of renewable energy in the power system.
